Jeanne Chinnis is a painter who is inspired by the Impressionist and Fauve painters. When painting her Florida landscapes, Chinnis “sees the colors of life vibrating beneath the form, my palette comes to life and my brush follows.” She exhibits her work at Sarasota and Anna Maria Island Galleries.

Robert Farrell is a master silversmith. He creates fantastic and intriguing sculptures of barns, water towers, and toys from sterling, copper, nickel and glass enamels. His work is in the collections of the Smithsonian's Renwick Gallery, the Victoria and Albert Museum and the Museum of Art and Design in New York City.


Pam Fox creates custom and hand-crafted jewelry. She grows and collects many of the natural objects used in her pieces, such as seeds, pods, and orchids. She takes impressions of these objects using dental techniques and then applies a variety of metalsmithing techniques to produce her exquisite jewelry.

Linda Heath is a self-taught artist. She creates art work using the ancient art form of gyotaku, creating beautiful color rubbings of fish. She catches her subject matter in the bayou outside her Manatee River home. She often displays her work at the Delray Art Festival, the Estero Fine Art Show, and at Lakewood Ranch Main Street

Joyce McAdams creates paintings, prints, ceramic tiles, fabrics, greeting cards, and installations. Her subject matter is inspired by her childhood reflections of "wondrous dreams of flying fish with iridescent wings gleaming in the moonlight." She has exhibited her work in more than 60 solo and group shows.

The Morean Art Center Glass Studio, located in St. Petersburg, Florida, is considered to be the best place to find art glass in the Tampa area. Three of the artists from this studio, **David Spurgeon, Pauli Nelson Maiville, and Doug Taylor Jr.**, will have their art works on display at the Galleria. They work and teach at M Morean.

Richard Pollack is a sculptor who studied art at the Cleveland Museum of Art. He begins each sculpture with reddish-brown clay, which he wedges, works, and rolls into slabs. He forms the slabs into shapes that suggest natural geological formations. He applies texture to each piece, then air dries it and treats the surface with an iron oxide. It is fired and then finished with a rotary wire brush.

Charles Townsend is a painter who gravitates toward anything watery for his subject matter – the Myakka River, Corkscrew Swamp, Big Cypress, ponds, and lakes. He says “a successful painting for me needs to feel energetic, spontaneous, and a bit mysterious.” He studied at the Rhode Island School of Design, the School of Visual Arts in New York City, and the University of Vermont.

Jacqueline Woolf uses watercolor to create both representational paintings and the base material for her abstract, dimensional collages. She teaches watercolor at Art Center Manatee, and is a prizewinner in national and regional watercolor shows. Jackie exhibits regularly in local galleries and her watercolors and collages are in more than 200 private collections.
