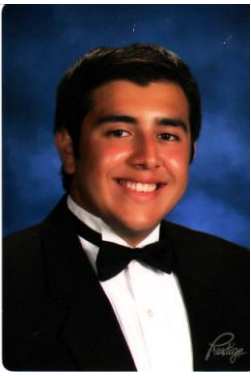
EMILY CAIN

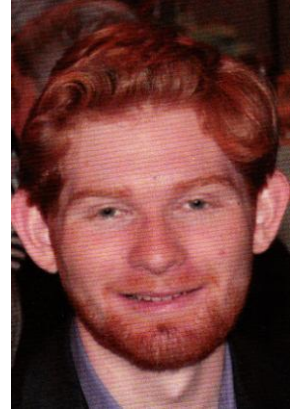




AUSTIN B. CANON

 State College of Florida

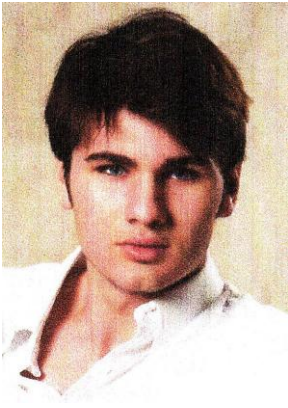

Savannah College of Art & Design

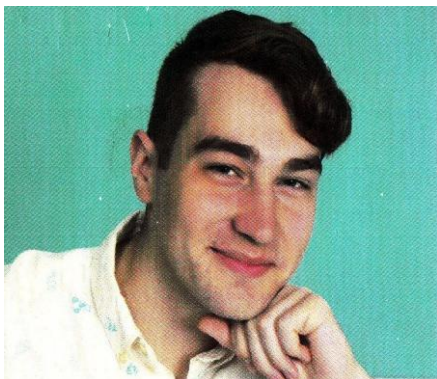

Florida State University

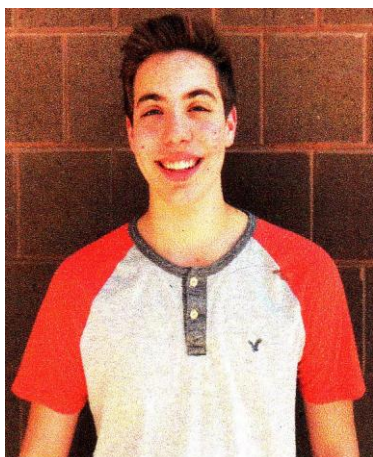
